All in all, he feels that we will end the year in a good place with about \$25,000 in the DCU.


Scott and Bob working in tandem have put together a budget of \$13K for Fiscal 2017

4.Committee Reports

a. Membership-Bob Ruckstuhl

2016 ACTUAL vs BUDGET DUES RECEIPTS (Cumulative)



Total membership numbers have not change significantly over the last 8 months (1321 as of today). However, <u>net</u> paying membership is down by 18 due to members' deaths.

Dues receipts are up well above forecast (see graph) and are projected to continue that trend through the end of the year for three reasons. (1) normal dues receipts, (2) dues payments prompted by the first quarter newsletter which will come out in December, and (3) due to a miscommunication with the printer the letter to members whose dues are in arrears will not go out until this week at which time we ought to see a onetime surge of dues receipts of just around \$1000.

2017 DUES FORECAST; In 2015 dues receipts exceeded budget forecast by 38%. The dues receipts for 2016 are projected to exceed forecast by approximately 35%. Scott's suggested number of \$13,000 for 2017 is as good as any. With membership numbers shrinking and more members having paid their dues a year or two ahead the high dues receipt numbers of 2015 and 2016 ought to start dropping

b. Condolences

In the absence of Mary Ann Hall, George presented her report indicating that 3 of our PRA members passed way during the last period.

C. Future Speakers

Our Spring meeting in May 2017 will host Victor McElheny author of Insisting on the Impossible, Book on Dr.Land's achievements.

Richard Rosenberg presented the results of the data which had the following Data: Of the 60% who responded, 80% want to keep the present days, not change to weekends. What about folks who never come? Luncheon schedule Preference

Arthur reviewed the somewhat unscientific results of the last luncheon table survey where only 97 of the 150+/_ attendees completed the survey. 49 voted to retain the present schedule; while 26 voted for Option A (delay meeting start time by one hour) and 22 voted for Option BJ (to delay the meeting by 1 1/2 hours and hold the business meeting and luncheon simultaneously). Based on the poor response (and the fact that many who may have objected to the current meeting format were not present to voice their opinions), the group decided to delay any changes in meeting format for the time being.

In response to an earlier group request to investigate a change in the luncheon selections. Arthur also reported that expanding the menu options from two to three would cost us and extra \$3.00 PER PLATE.

He also reviewed other menu options, but the group felt that none represented a desired change from the current menu options. So, we will keep the menu unchanged.




