PRA Retirement Survey Results

October, 2009

<u>The survey:</u> When one approaches retirement, the question often arises, "what am I going to do with all that time?". Many and varied have been the responses to that question, and part of the purpose of the PRA is to have our members share ideas on retirement including what activities they are involved with. This will provide new thinking and new options to other members for activities they might choose to engage in during their retirement years. The possibilities of retirement activities may only be limited by one's ability to imagine that those possibilities exist. Studies have shown that the more active you are, the more healthy and long lived you tend to be. We want to use the results of this survey as one more vehicle to provide ideas to enrich the retirement years of our members.

- Hoped for 4% response, but achieved 2% (39 responses)
- About 2/3 of the responders travel annually, split just about evenly between domestic and international
- Almost all who responded (36 / 39) are snowbirds, traveling to Florida in the winter from several weeks to six months.
- About 2/3 are involved with their grandkids.
- There are more than a dozen different hobbies pursued.
- · Sports are not as important as in earlier parts of life., as fewer people are involved.
- Volunteering is big with many members involved with more than one organization. In fact, volunteering is the biggest single activity our retired members are involved with. The number of different organizations and the different services provided are very broad.
- About a quarter are running a business.
- More than a third work, mostly part time.
- · A few teach.
- · A little fewer than a third attend some form of classes.
- A touch less than half are dealing with health issues.
- Most common advice shared:

Keep busy and active (8) (never been so busy) Stay healthy, follow up on any and all medical concerns quickly (3)


